Shared the Proclamation for Social Work Month that was shared at the meeting of the Village Board on February 23, 2026. Discussed the important role that social workers have in the Senior Outreach Services Department and within other organizations within the community.
- b. Presentation on the development of Tri-shaw bike program, Cycling without Age.
Presentation by Sharon Fankhauser and Mike Flaherty about their group's initiative to develop a Tri-shaw bike program to provide accessible bike rides to older adults and people with disabilities in McFarland. They shared a video and discussed the journey towards raising funds and support in order to purchase a tri-shaw bicycle. They discussed the need to secure non-profit status, procure insurance, storage and volunteer recruitment and coordination for "pilots" to

navigate the bikes. Discussed models in other communities that developed partnerships with the business community. The group is hoping to raise \$40,000.

c. *Presentation of Dane County Senior Center models, including Waunakee Senior Center and Middleton Senior Center.*

Reviewed elements of the programming and space at both the Middleton Senior Center and the Waunakee Senior Center. Discussed staffing, program offerings, and spaces to accommodate. Shared photos and discussed alignment with needs identified for evolving McFarland Senior Outreach Service's needs. Referenced documents available on the Village of McFarland website including the 2017 Facility Master Plan and the 2023 McFarland Municipal Campus Plan.

YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED

WHAT SHOULD I DO IF A MEAL DELIVERY CLIENT IS NOT ANSWERING THE DOOR?

Usually, our clients let us know if they will not be home to receive a meal. But all of you have occasionally been in the situation where a client is not answering the door unexpectedly.

This is the procedure to follow:

1. Call the client at the phone number(s) on the route sheet.
2. If there is no answer, call Dawn at the number on the top of the route sheet (this is for the cell phone in the kitchen).
3. Continue on with your route. Bring the meal back to the Municipal Center. Do NOT leave the meal (even if there is a note on the door to do so). This is for client and food safety reasons.
4. Dawn will alert Sara and Brittney, the Case Managers, and they will make contact with the client or their emergency contact person. If they cannot make contact with either, they will schedule a wellness check with the McFarland Police Department or the Dane County Sheriff's office.



Please do not worry that the client won't get a meal that day. If the client is home or has returned home and needs a meal, we will make sure they get one.

Housing Costs: We continue to see clients struggling with housing insecurity, as rent costs are high and affordable housing in Dane County is challenging to find. We provided rental assistance twice in Q1 via grants from McFarland Area Outreach Endowment, each in the highest annual amount available of \$500. Both were for individuals living in Section 42 Affordable Housing in McFarland at Taylor Point. Rents have increased for 2026, creating challenges for older adults who live on fixed budgets, often with the only source of income coming from Social Security, which does not have significant cost of living increases to keep up with inflation. Lot rent at Bayview Trailer Park in the Town of Dunn is also increasing, with some clients reporting that lot rents have doubled in 2026. We continue to work with one client who is homeless and multiple clients who are at risk of homelessness.

Tax Help: Case managers assisted older adults with making appointments for free tax filing via the Richard Dilley Tax Center on South Park Street in Madison. The appointments have been full since early March, and there are limited other options for free or affordable tax help. It is a goal for McFarland Senior Outreach to resume providing a tax clinic in the future through AARP's VITA program. We had offered this prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, however the volunteers who coordinated this program retired from volunteering. Recruitment for new volunteers has not yet yielded a replacement team to run a McFarland-based tax clinic.

Caregiver Stress: Case Managers continue to work with families who are coordinating complicated caregiving needs. Oftentimes children are attempting to coordinate care for their aging parents from afar. There are also instances where

both partners in a household need care, or multi-generational households with both the parent and the child needing care. Care networks and supportive care agencies are often challenged with meeting the increased need.

Dementia: Many case management clients are struggling with dementia while living independently in the community. Case managers work closely to coordinate services and regularly liaise with the McFarland Police Department Community Resource Officer, Sydney Bomkamp who leads the CARES program (previously Are U Okay?) to support these clients and monitor safety concerns. A Dementia Caregiver Support Group was initiated in February and, beginning in March, a concurrent Dementia Activity Group was added, facilitated by a volunteer to provide programming for loved ones with dementia, as well as respite for caregivers.

Transportation: Ride requests for RSVP Rides have been increasing, including the number of unique riders and the number of ride requests per person. Clients are requesting rides for more frequent appointments and longer duration appointments (such as chemotherapy infusions, radiation treatments, etc). Appointments that exceed 2 hours in length require two separate drivers to provide rides for the journey to and from the clinic, which then in turn limits the availability of drivers for other rides. Clients are more frequently requesting to change ride scheduling as their clinics change the appointment times, causing additional staff time to communicate with volunteer drivers and accommodate adjustments.

Healthcare Costs/Restricted Budgets: We have had an increase in clients who have been applying for UW Health/Unity Point Meriter Financial Assistance and SSM/Dean Financial Assistance. If granted, these programs will pay for part or all a client’s healthcare bills that have been incurred by their network providers. These applications require substantial supporting documentation to process. Case Managers help clients to complete the applications and procure documentation to submit. Many of these clients do pay premiums for Medicare Advantage Plans for healthcare coverage, but struggle to pay for the co-pays and co-insurance for healthcare visits or procedures. This can lead some clients to forgo recommended treatments or therapies.

Changes to Case Management Documentation Processes: With direction from Dane County, all focal point case managers are required to follow new, standardized protocol for client case management. This includes new forms, timelines, and reporting guidelines. We are also implementing new methods for streamlined tracking of data to improve organization and communication.
