**Public Safety Committee Minutes**

**1. CALL TO ORDER, ROLL CALL.**

Chairperson Stephanie Brassington called the regular meeting of the Public Safety Committee to order at 6:30 PM in the Community Room.

Staff Present: Police Chief Aaron Chapin, Fire Chief Chris Dennis, Deputy Clerk Tanya O'Malley

**2. PUBLIC APPEARANCES.**

Bill Burse appeared to voice concerns regarding burning permits and having smoke coming into his home every spring. He also voiced concerns about the Ash wood having been treated. He is working with the fire department on solutions, but suggested the promotion of more gas fire pits. Chairperson Stephanie Brassington thanked him for bringing the issue to the committee's attention and will get it on the appropriate committee and agenda for the future.

**3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES.**

*a. Approve the minutes from the 4/13/2021 PSC Meeting.*

Motion by Village Trustee Stephanie Brassington, second by Member Sandy Bakk, to approve Approve the minutes from the 4/13/2021 PSC Meeting. Motion carries 4 - 0 - 0 by acclamation.

*a. Welcome Police Chief Aaron Chapin*

Chairperson Stephanie welcomed Police Chief Aaron Chapin and to the meeting.

*b. Staff Reports*

*1) Fire and Rescue Department*

Fire Chief Chris Dennis reviewed the monthly reports for April and May.

*2) Police Department*

Police Chief Aaron Chapin reviewed the monthly reports for April and May.

*c. Discussion and recommendation to the Village Board on an application from the McFarland Youth Hockey Association for a Temporary Class B license for fermented malt beverages and wine for the Draft Experience Adult Hockey Tournament to be held on June 26-27, 2021.*

Meghan Rapp was present to represent McFarland Youth Hockey. Police Chief Chapin reviewed his concerns regarding the event as well as the mitigation strategies the McFarland Youth Hockey Administration will implement. Meghan Rapp was present to represent the McFarland Youth Hockey Association.

Motion by Village Trustee Stephanie Brassington, second by Member Shannon Morrison, to recommend approval to the Village Board on an application from the McFarland Youth Hockey Association for a Temporary Class B license for fermented malt beverages and wine for the Draft Experience Adult Hockey Tournament to be held on June 25-27, 2021, with a variance to allow the sale of alcohol where minors are present. Motion carries 6 - 0 - 0 by acclamation.

d. License Hearing -

1) Conduct hearing on the recommendation from Chief Chapin to deny the issuance of an operator's license for Allyson Donohue for the period ending June 30, 2022.

A hearing on the recommendation to deny the issuance of an Alcohol Beverage Operator's License for Allyson Donohue was conducted at 7:10 p.m. by the Public Safety Committee on June 9, 2021 in the Community Room of the McFarland Municipal Center, 5915 Milwaukee Street, McFarland, Wisconsin. The hearing was conducted per McFarland Village Ordinance 11-67(d). Public Safety Committee members present were Member Sandy Bakk, Village Trustee Stephanie Brassington, Member Shannon Morrison, Member Dottie Olson, Member Rich Staley, and Village Trustee Edward Wreh. Staff present were Police Chief Aaron Chapin and Deputy Clerk Tanya O'Malley. Others present were applicant Allyson Donohue and Nathanael Romick.

Administrative Assistant Reimer swore in Chief Chapin, who presented the following testimony:

The police department conducted a background check for the purpose of issuing an operator's license to Allyson Donohue. Part of the check is to look at driver's license convictions and criminal records that would be substantially connected to serving or sale of alcohol. On the driver's license check there was a conviction for an OWI occurring on October 23, 2019, and also a conviction for an OWI occurring on January 18, 2017. Both fall within the past five years. Chief Chapin explained Village Policy Ordinance 11-74(c)(3) and explained based on the past practice of the Village and the Village ordinance, it requires the police department recommend denial of the operator's license.

Administrative Assistant Reimer swore in Allyson Donohue, who provided the following testimony:

Allyson Donohue explained the things she has been doing to change her lifestyle and submitted paperwork showing her alcohol assessment completion. She has held an operator's license in Cottage Grove for the past 18 months without any problems and was approved the previous night for a Fitchburg operator's license. She explained the ignition interlock device on her car and wanting to keep it long-term to make sure this never happens again.

Administrative Assistant swore in Nathanael Romick, who provided the following testimony:

Allyson's been working for them the last 18 months and she's done great. There've been no issues with underage selling. They get occasional cigarette stings, and there have been no issues with that.

The hearing was closed at 7:27 p.m.

The Committee proceeded with discussion on a recommendation.

2) Discussion and recommendation on the operator's license for Allyson Donohue for the period ending June 30, 2022.

The committee discussed the possible contingencies to put in place for the approval of the operator's license.

Motion by Village Trustee Stephanie Brassington, second by Edward Wreh, to recommend approval to the Village Board on the operator's license for Allyson Donohue for the period ending June 30, 2022, with the stipulation of conducting quarterly records checks to ensure there are no violations of any offenses that would be cause for recommendation of denial until the offense in question is outside of the five year time frame, and there is no other reason policy would would prohibit denial of license. If any violation is found, a revocation process would begin. Motion carries 6 - 0 - 0 by acclamation.

e. Discussion and recommendation Resolution 2021-13: a resolution approving the renewal of applications for liquor and fermented malt beverages licenses for 2021-2022.

Deputy Clerk O'Malley explained that alcohol licenses expire June 30 every year. Compliance and background inspections were done on every business, and all passed the background checks.

Motion by Village Trustee Stephanie Brassington, second by Member Dottie Olson, to recommend approval to the Village Board of Resolution 2021-13: a resolution approving the renewal of applications for liquor and fermented malt beverages licenses for 2021-2022. Motion carries 6 - 0 - 0 by acclamation.

f. Review and discussion of the availability/accessibility of use of the hardship process and policy for ambulance billing for the Fire & Rescue Department.

Fire Chief Dennis reviewed the hardship process, and the group discussed the timeline for waivers. PSC will take action on this process at the next meeting.

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# **Department Report For June 2021 Activity**

- **Operations**

- We are in the process of moving our training records, payroll, and assessment management to ESO Solutions. We are beginning the process to move scheduling to ESO Solutions to aid in payroll. The process has been time consuming, but we are seeing future efficiencies of the software and improved tracking.
- We are continuing to utilize our duty officer to assist on most medical calls. We will be attempting to increase our paid-on-call EMT staff to attempt more three-person crews and reduce the reliance on the duty officer position to avoid burnout for our duty officers. We are planning a paid-on-call EMT recruitment drive.
- We have been working with a citizen concerned about burning in firepits and campfires in the Village. We are completing research on burning regulations in place with other Villages and Cities within Dane County. We are also working with the Village Attorney to determine if the Village can regulate Babcock County Park.
- We have been invited to send two individuals to the Flints Hills Pine Bend Refinery in Rosemount, Minnesota. We will receive a stipend to cover the cost of the lodging and travel expenses for the individuals. We have Division Chief Brian Molenaar and Acting Officer John Venturino selected to attend.

- **COVID-19 Precautions**

- The following initiatives were implemented and continue:
  - We have closed the Fire & Rescue area to non-essential people, including Village and department staff.
  - Daily cleaning within the Fire & Rescue area for high contact and high traffic areas.

- Shift changes are performed with social distancing and are required to be completed in ten minutes or less.
- The Engines, Squad, and Ladder are only staffed with four firefighters.
- Social distancing is used among staff during the day.
- We have transitioned back to surgical masks, and safety glasses being utilized on every medical call. Surgical masks or face coverings are used performing fire inspections and interacting with the public.
- N95 masks, isolation gowns, and safety glasses are used on any patient contact tested positive, suspected of COVID-19, or a higher risk procedure is performed (nebulizer, high flow oxygen, CPAP, CPR, etc.).
- **Personnel**
  - Current Staffing Levels
    - Full-time Fire & Rescue Chief – 1
    - Full-time Administrative Captain – 1
    - Full-time Fire Inspector/Public Education Specialist – 1
    - Full-time EMTs – 4 (2 vacancies)
    - Full-time Confidential Administrative Assistant – 1 (50%)
    - Paid-On-Call – 49 (10 EMTs (1 on medical leave), 21 Firefighters (1 Active Retired), 8 EMR/Firefighter, & 10 EMT/Firefighters)
    - Total Staffing Level – 57
  - We are pleased to announce that Mackenzie Frie will be starting on July 12 as our newest 24-Hour Career EMT. Mackenzie has been working with Brooklyn EMS in 0.75 FTE capacity and volunteering with Green County EMS and Juda Fire Department. We are also please to be getting close to completing background for our other 24-Hour EMT vacancy.
  - We must express considerable gratitude to our paid-on-call EMTs/EMRs, Fire Inspector and Administrative Captain for pitching and helping to keep our ambulance in service. Our overtime during the first part of 2021 has been able to be kept low considering we have two career staff vacancies. June, July, and August we will see higher than normal overtime because paid-on-call staff is not able to maintain the high levels they have been.
  - We do have three applicants for paid-on-call and will be interviewing them soon.

- **Budget**

- 2021 Budget capital purchasing has not been started beyond the ladder truck.
- We have purchased 275 gallons of PFAS free and green screen certified alcohol resistant class B foam with funds from Flint Hills Resources. We still need to purchase 385 gallons of foam to complete filling the foam trailer/tender. We are hoping to make some of that purchase in 2021 and the remainder in 2022.

We are beginning to catch up on inspections and plan to make considerable gain in August and more in September when career staffing returns to authorized levels.

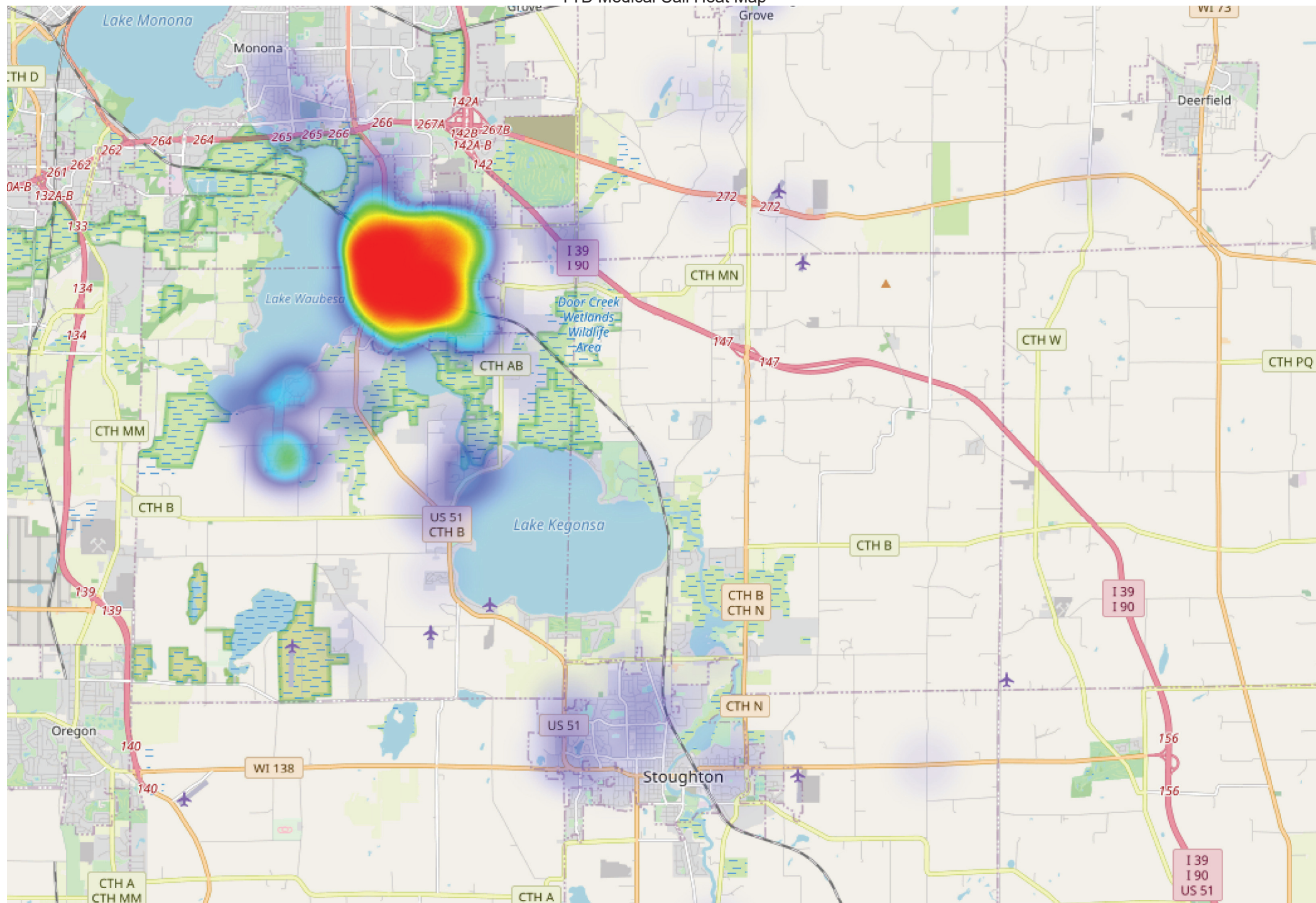
### **Apparatus & Equipment**

- We have completed hose and nozzle testing by our third-party vendor. We did experience issues with weather that required the testing to be stopped on the first day and had to completed on a second day. We had about a dozen lengths fail testing due to a variety of issues. We will be evaluating the reasons and comparing to the age of the hose inventory to complete repairs or replacement. We have a considerable amount of hose from the mid-nineties due to a massive replacement that occurred at that time. The department would replace the hose with

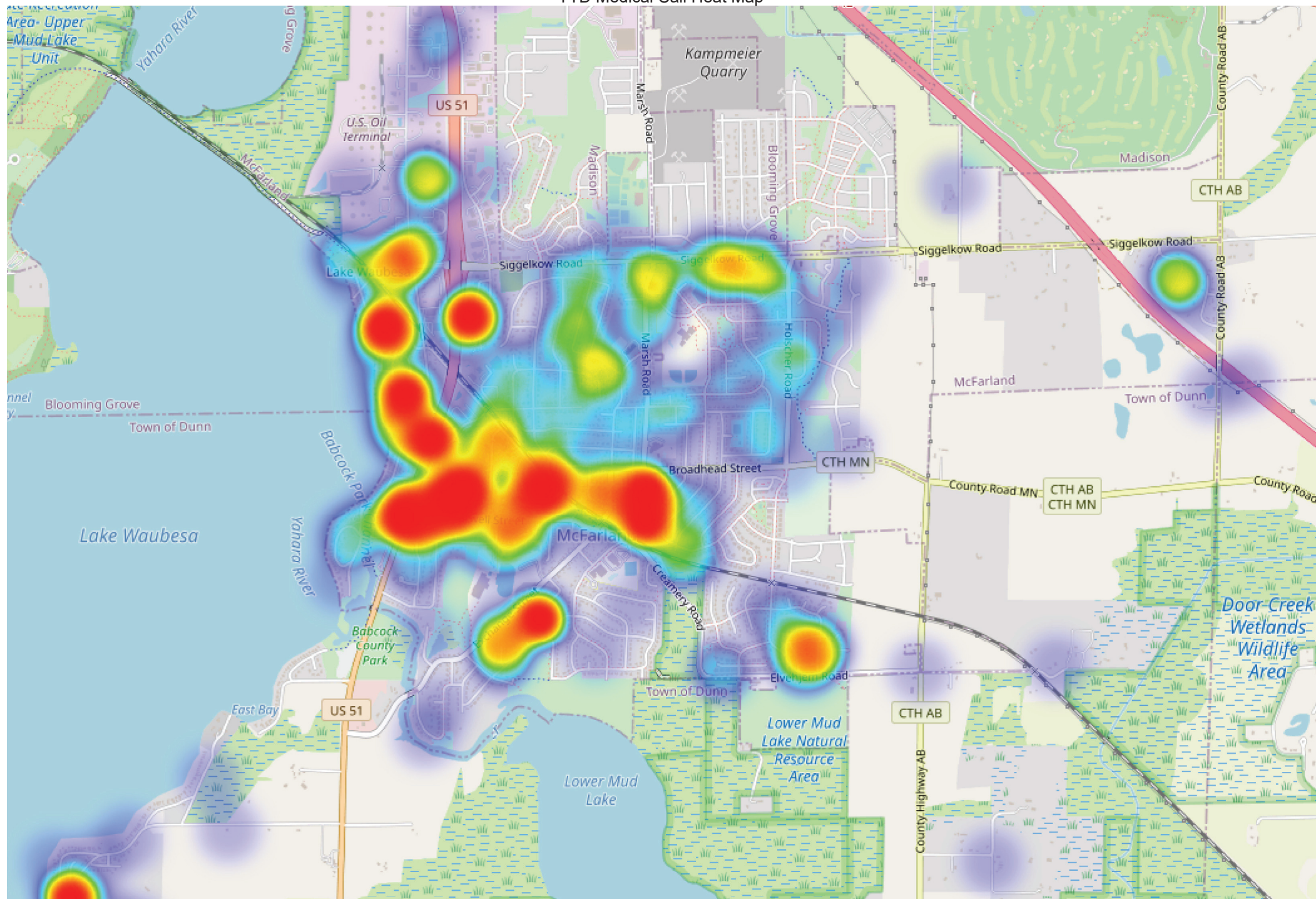
a fire truck before the nineties keeping the hose at a 20-year life cycle. In the nineties, the usage of hose changed, and departments began having spare hose which changed the replacement plans. We are attempting to place hose back on a similar 20-year cycle.

- 2015 Tanker (Tender 6) the rear tank dump valve is still experiencing issues, and the manufacturer is developing a solution with adding additional position switches and solenoids. We are awaiting our vendor to receive parts to adjust. It is operating but not in proper sequence.
- 2019 Pumper (Engine 2) is experiencing an issue with the Compressed Air Foam (CAF) system's air compressor. The thermostat was replaced, and the operation improved, but we have experienced a recurrence. The system is scheduled for further evaluation in May.
- 2005 Pumper (Engine 1)
  - Is having new pump panel gauges installed. The current gauges cracked due to the overhead heating in the apparatus bay. The installation is taking some time as Assistant Chief Reiter is performing the repair for cost savings.
  - We have been experiencing a leak on the truck and are attempting to confirm if it is fuel filter or steering gear boxes. The fuel filter will be replaced, and the situation monitored.
- 2000 Heavy Rescue (Squad 5) developed a substantial leak on transmission. The Village Mechanic reviewed the leak and determined not to repair due to the truck being removed from service soon.
- The new Utility Truck construction is progressing. It is planned to be shipped from Florida to Wisconsin in July. It will require work at the Dealership for about one-month moving equipment from the Heavy Rescue.
- The replacement aerial has been placed on order with the idle reduction option as recommended by the sustainability committee. We are waiting to have an updated build and delivery schedule.

## June 2021 Monthly Report

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## **McFarland Police Department**

### **Calls for Service**

The Department had 655 calls for service in June 2021 compared to 532 in 2020. The Department call volume is continuing to climb to similar call volume prior to the COVID pandemic.

### **Cases of Interest:**

6/22/2021 – Officers observed two vehicles racing on Highway 51. One of the vehicles failed to stop for officers. After a short pursuit that was terminated, the vehicle was located approaching Stoughton, tire deflation devices were deployed, and the vehicle eventually stopped. The 13-year-old driver was arrested for fleeing/eluding police and operating motor vehicle without owner's consent.

6/26/2021 – Officers conducted a traffic stop for a vehicle speeding, 98 mph in 55 mph zone. After investigation, the driver was arrested for Operating While Intoxicated 3<sup>rd</sup> with Passenger Under 16, Reckless Driving/Endangering Safety, Possess Open Intoxicants in Motor Vehicle. The driver provided a breath sample, resulting 0.19.

### **Staffing Report**

The Department is currently operating three positions (Two Officers and Sergeant) short. Police Officer recruitment is underway with the Police and Fire Commission interviews and Chief of Police Interviews conducted in June. Three conditional offers were extended to candidates, contingent on background investigation, psychological and medical exams. The Sergeant candidates completed the written test and outside panel interviews in June. Police and Fire Commission interviews are scheduled in July.

### **Training Report**

COVID has made it difficult to get officers to training due to facilities being closed for in-person training. Emergency Vehicle Operations and Control in-service was scheduled for May and June. Two training dates were completed in June.

- Officer Craft and Officer Zietsma attended a UAS (drone) training in Black River Falls.

- 
- Department In-Service was completed in June. The trainings began in May to obtain required training in Emergency Vehicle Operations and Control.

## **Officer Complaints/Compliments**

**Officer Complaints** – Officer complaints can be submitted using the online procedure found on the Departments web page or also by calling the Police Department and asking to talk to a supervisor.

- No Complaints were received in June 2021.

**Officer Compliments** - Officer compliments can be submitted using the online form found on the Departments web page, by submitting an email to the Department, or by calling the Police Department and asking to talk to a supervisor.

- No Compliments were received in June 2021.

## **Use of Force Incidents**

The Department wishes to operate in a more transparent way so a section on Use of Force Incidents will be added to the monthly report. The Department categorizes a reportable Use of Force Incident as anytime a firearm or ECD is used or displayed, or any other force is used that is at or above a compliance hold as outlined in the Intervention Options issued by the State standards.

All reportable Use of Force Incidents are reviewed by a supervisor which consists of reading reports and watching body camera or squad video of the incident. The supervisor is checking for compliance with policy, training, and acceptable standards issued by the State. If a problem is identified, the officer could be disciplined, counseled, and/or mandatory re-training will be ordered. Incidents last month were:

- 2021-204321 Domestic Disturbance – Officers were dispatched to a domestic disturbance. One of the subjects was argumentative and not following orders to exit the residence. The subject started resisting and pulling away from officers when they attempt an escort hold. The subject was stabilized on the ground and handcuffed.
- 2021-232071 Fleeing – Officers attempted to conduct a traffic stop; the driver fled in the vehicle. Stoughton Police were able to successfully deploy tire deflation devices. Shortly after the vehicle stopped in Stoughton and a high-risk stop was conducted. Officers displayed their firearms at the vehicle but were not used during the high-risk traffic stop. Three juveniles were taken into custody.

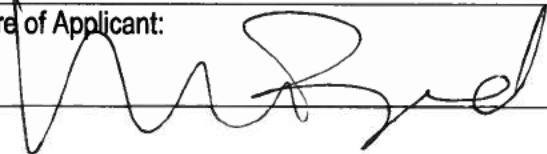

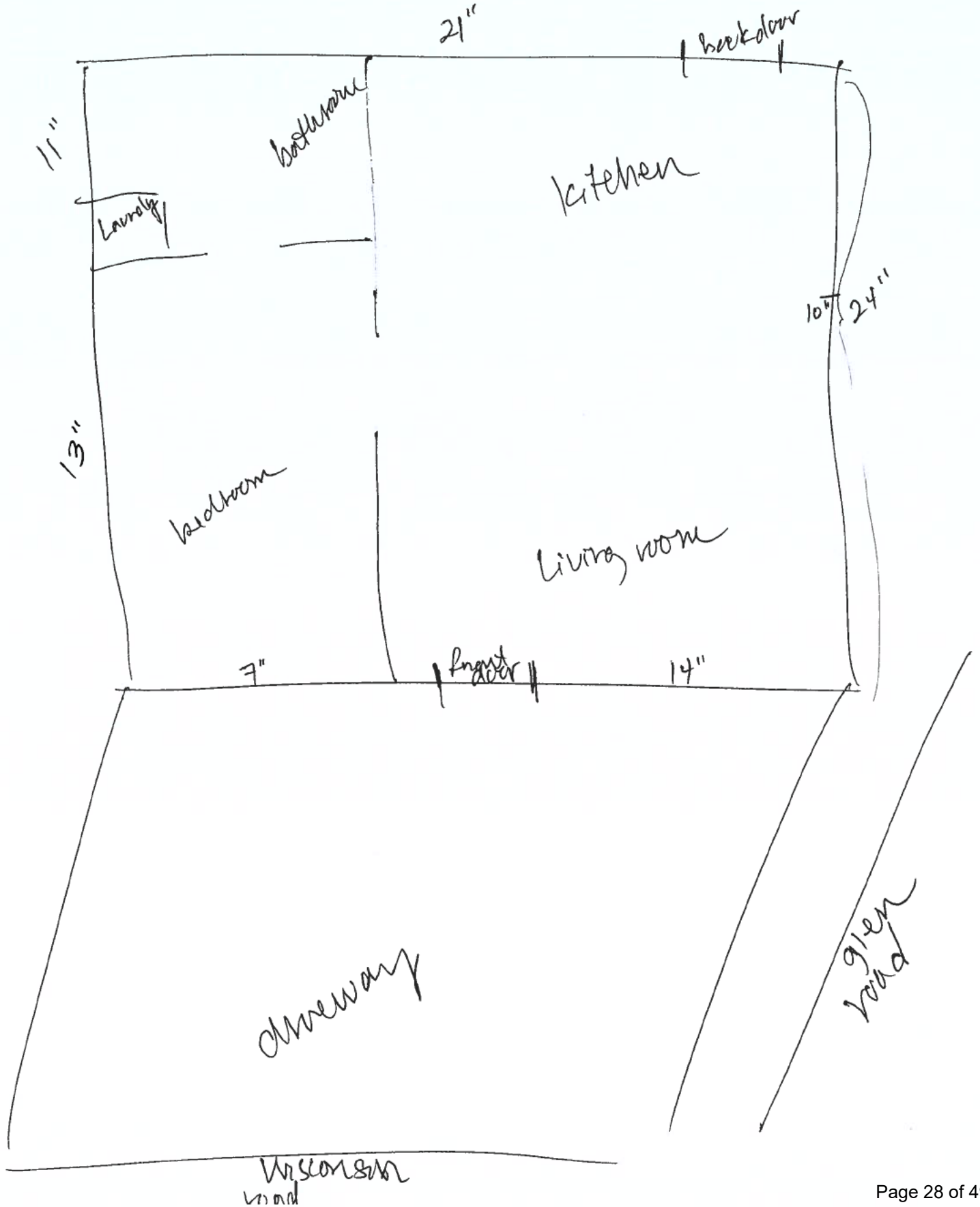

The rental will also not likely attract anyone looking to visit Madison because of the hundreds of Airbnb and hotel options with closer proximity and similar pricing. There are currently two larger homes in McFarland that are being rented out as Airbnb's, with both of them being directly on the lake. Our neighbors and my family are concerned for the types of short-term renters this residential housing would attract. Which leads me to our concern about safety.

My wife and I have a two-year-old daughter and a two-week-old daughter so safety was at the top of our priority list when choosing our home. Having a short-term rental is a safety concern because Airbnb is very clear that the background checks they perform "have several limitations" and do not capture full criminal history for guests. Also, anyone staying with the guest does not receive a background check. Airbnb has known issues regarding safety, along with concerns in disrupting the order of neighborhoods and communities. The increased safety risk to my family makes this reason enough to not allow this permitting.

Our backyard runs right into the backyard of 4514 Wisconsin Avenue with no clear lot line or privacy fence, as the property was recently separated from one into two (see attached picture from our yard for reference). This was not a concern to us when we initially moved here in January because we assumed we would have a neighbor that we would get to know. However, the thought of having our young girls and neighborhood kids playing out in the yard with a different stranger staying there every week is scary. With this being a 480 square foot tiny home, guests will most likely want to get out of the small space and utilize the backyard fire pit, which is roughly 20' from our lot line. This means that we will constantly have strangers within 10-20' of our home where my kids like to play. The Public Safety Committee can't possibly find this safe without a privacy fence to keep our children safe. And we'd ask that if for some reason the permit is allowed, the rental property put up a privacy fence to clearly separate the properties. Additionally, this Airbnb listed as 'Pet Friendly', which we are not ok with, especially without a fence. We have already had issues with Nora having her dog off-leash and letting it run up to my two year old and lick her face, which scared her. Their dog has also ran around our yard off-leash and peed in several locations. If Nora can't control her own dog, I don't expect her

to be able to enforce anything with her guests. Nora also mentions on her Airbnb posting that “the blue house behind us has a dog that is not friendly with other dogs.”, which refers to us. We do not want her posting anything about our house, family, or dog, especially when we only want people to abide by local ordinances, such as leash laws.

Our neighborhood and household turn in for the night quite early. Our bedroom windows face the backyard and we are definitely concerned that there will be a significant amount of noise coming from the bonfire area in close proximity to us and the surrounding neighbors. I also fear that there will be alcohol consumption around the bonfire and people could find their way into our yard without a privacy fence, or it could lead to public intoxication. We have many concerns with strangers and travelers not following local safety ordinances.

All in all, this is a family neighborhood. This 1 bedroom Airbnb would not attract the type of people we want in our community or in my backyard. The safety concerns and the risks for my family are too great for the Public Safety Committee to approve this permitting. I know that everyone in our neighborhood would be more accepting of a long-term rental at this home, but the short-term model will not work. Our close-knit neighbors have expressed similar concerns around having a one-bedroom tourist rental among all of our family homes and hopefully you receive their concerns in addition to ours.

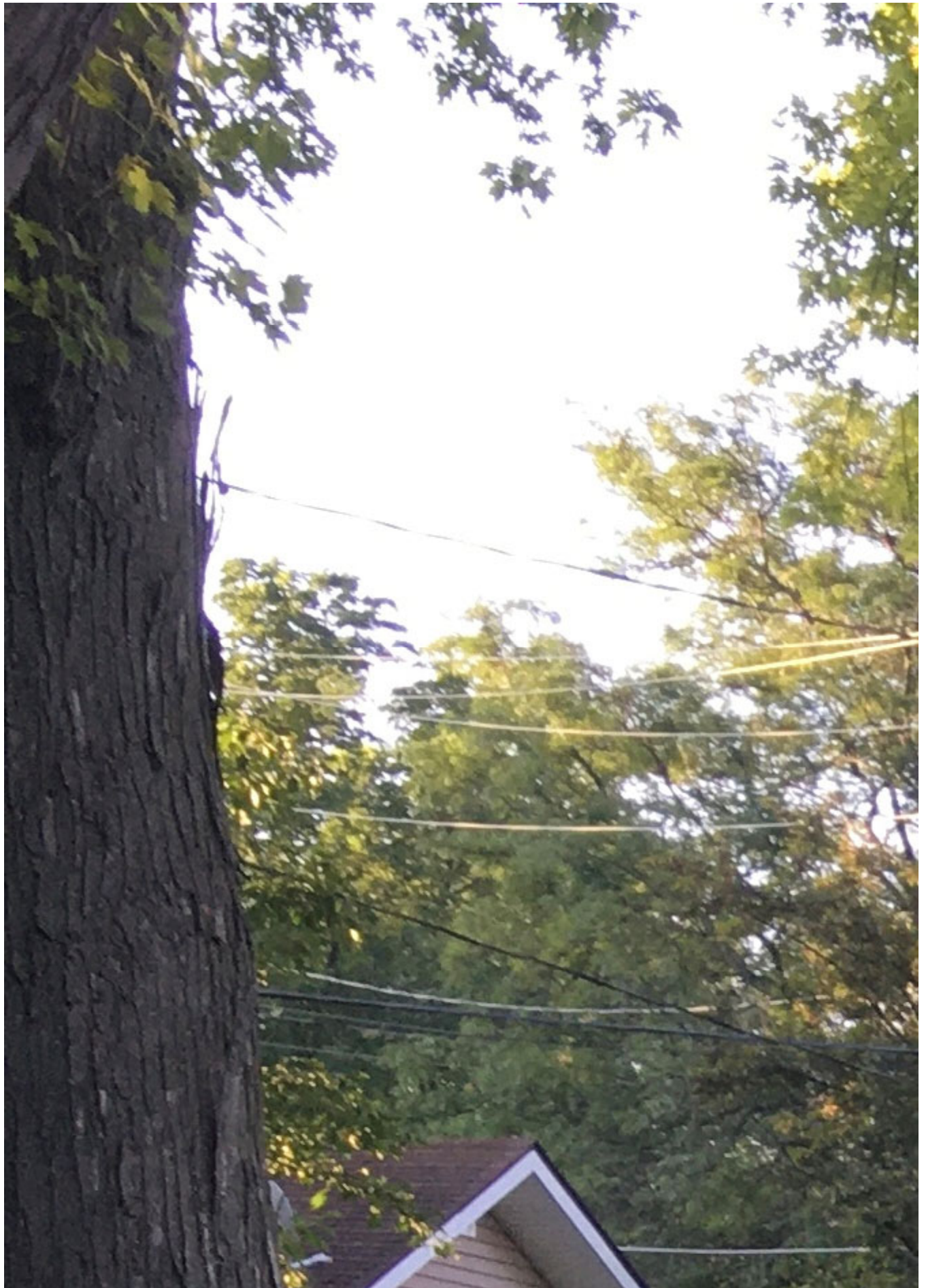

  - If amplified music is playing, have the music stop and if possible calmly announce the need to evacuate to the nearest exit.
  - Individuals will need to be designated in assisting in evacuating individuals to the nearest exit. Keep in mind most individuals will attempt to exit the same way they accessed the area. The exit will most likely not be able to handle the number of individuals exiting and have people near the exits to allow them to exit quickly while ushering individuals to the exit.
  - Designate an area of event-goers to an assembly area that is away from the building, fire department vehicle access. We want to allow access for fire trucks and firefighters to address the situation.
  - In the event, an individual is unwilling to exit do not put individuals at risk in attempting to remove the individual. Notify the initial arriving first responders.
- Actions to be taken in the event of a medical emergency.
  - Call 911 to report the incident. The 911 operator will have several questions but know the Fire & Rescue Department will be notified while questions are being obtained.
  - Identify individuals that can assist in getting responders from the entrance of the area to the individual that is in need of medical care. Note more than one vehicle will often respond and maybe several depending on the situation. Having adequate staff to remain in locations to direct additional vehicles responding is preferred.

**ISSUE SUMMARY:**

The Fire & Rescue Department has received a request from a resident to revise the open burning ordinance to restrict the usage of campfires and firepits. The resident did speak to the Public Safety Committee at the June 9, 2021 meeting about their concerns. The Fire & Rescue Department had been working with the individual to identify burning that had not complied with the current ordinance. During the process of identifying the sources of irritating smoke, it was noted that campfires and firepits are permitted to burn untreated firewood, and those fires are causing further concern. One possible reoccurring location that has been identified is the Babcock Campground located on Highway 51 at Burma Road.

The Fire & Rescue Department completed a review of the burning ordinances in Dane County with respect to campfires, fire pits, and outdoor fireplaces. The results are included in the packet for reference. In general, the Village has similar ordinances to the majority of the municipalities in Dane County. The current ordinance is also attached for reference. The Village attorney was consulted about regulating the burning at Babcock County Park and the Village would not have the power to regulate conduct within county parks.

Two possible revisions have been recommended by the resident. One is to restrict campfires and firepits to be LP or natural gas-fueled only. The other recommendation being to restrict the usage to the second and fourth weekends similar to the current permitted open burning.

Sec. 26-80. - Open burning.

- (a) *Prohibited.* No person, firm or corporation shall build any outdoor fire within the corporate limits of the Village excepting as set forth in Subsection (b) of this Section. This prohibition on burning includes burning of construction waste and debris at construction sites.
- (b) *Exceptions.*
  - (1) Outdoor cooking over a fire contained in a device or structure designed for such use is permissible;
  - (2) Controlled burning of grass or similar vegetation for environmental management purposes, with the prior written approval of the Fire/EMS Chief, may be permitted; this exception is not to be used for the burning of grass, leaves or other lawn debris;
  - (3) Ceremonial campfire or bonfires, with prior written approval of the Fire/EMS Chief, may be permitted;
  - (4) Other occasions of desirable outdoor burning not specified by this Subsection, but not as an alternative to refuse removal or disposal of which other methods are available, may be granted single occasion approval as in Subsections (b)(2) and (b)(3) of this Section;
  - (5) Any person desiring to burn wood, brush or other combustible material shall apply to the Fire/EMS Chief. Any person obtaining a permit to burn shall follow the instructions and directions prescribed by said Fire/EMS Chief and shall permit said Fire/EMS Chief or designee to come upon the property in order to exercise the supervisory function. Whenever approval and special permit are granted by the Fire/EMS Chief under this Section, the permit may specify and be conditioned on observance of safety restrictions and insurance requirements set forth therein;
  - (6) Campfires and fire pits burning untreated firewood only (not construction materials) that do not unreasonably disturb neighbors and are attended at all times by an adult at least 18 years old. Campfires and fire pits must be ten feet or more from any lot line, utility pole or overhead wire. Properties with commercial buildings and residential buildings containing three or more dwellings units are permitted only with a listed fire pit or fireplace with a spark arrestor.
- (c) *Chief may prohibit.* The Fire/EMS Chief may prohibit any or all bonfires and outdoor fires when atmospheric conditions or local circumstances make such fires hazardous.
- (d) *Burning on streets.* No materials may be burned upon any street, curb, gutter or sidewalk.
- (e) *Liability.* Persons utilizing and maintaining outdoor fires shall be responsible for any liability resulting from damage caused by such person's fire.
